Today's mail call was more like it. I got your sweet letter of June 14th. Wonder if all the mail is getting thru' these days? I don't see any reason why it shouldn't. Kind of keep track of them, and let me know, honey. Since May 29th. I've written every day except Sunday and Monday of that pass, and Wednesday travelling back.

We're you getting a shampoo, and set at the beauty parlor that day, sweetie? I think your hair looks keen the way you're wearing it, darling. I'll bet it's lots cooler, and easier to take care of too, isn't it?

I had a trip to Hersfeld again today. We picked up the PX rations, and I was swinging Coca Cola dases around the way I used to. Sure hope it isn't too long till I'll be doing that every day. It's been good and hot today. Hope we get a lot of this weather. I can stand a lot of summer, but I don't go much for winter.

If that envelope looks kind of beat up on the letter I sent you yesterday, sweetie it's because I opened it up after I sealed it the first time. I'd forgotten to put the snapshot in I said I was going to.

Yes, Menno is Pat Baumann's real name. I wonder if he's overseas somewhere. Did it say in the paper?

Darling, I love you so very very much. You're my first thought in the morning, and my last thought at nite, and then I dream of you. You're such a wonderful dream girl, sweetie, but you're even better in person. You're everything I allways wanted my wife to be, and never thought I could really find. You're such a dear, sweet lover girl. I marvel at how lucky I am to have you for my very own precious wife.

You bet we'll love all your cute little sayings, sweetie. You're such a cute darling. We could allways be so happy just playing Russian Bank or Chinese Checkers. Just as long as we're together it doesn't matter much what we do. Once in a while I could get a laugh out of you too, honey. Remember, "This little bastard will have to come in on his own steam." Life is such a wonderful adventure when I share it with you, darling. Soon, maybe not tomorrow, but soon we'll be enjoying our good way of life together, sweetie.

I'm enclosing lots of hugs, and juicy kisses, and all my love.
