It sure seems nice to hear a little music. I'm certainly glad that this is my last winter in the army tho'. It's going to be so wonderful to be in our own little place with you once more darling. It's such a good feeling to come home from work to our little home. Oh darling I'm just existing till that happy day.

I've been keeping plenty busy, but I'd still rather be working like this than standing all those chump formations we had in the 78th. I'm glad I got out of that division.

Darling it seems as if all I can write about any more is how glad I'll be to get home. Please forgive me for being such a one track mind, but everything I have and everything I want is a three letter word spelled YOU. I hope we're both pleasantly surprised, and I get home much sooner than we could ever imagine. I love you so sweet heart. Any time we have to spend apart is just something that has to be existed thru' and when we're together again I can start to live.

I got something for you honey, and I'm going to send it as soon as I can find some wrapping paper. I'm going to send you a money order later, and you can get something for yourself with it for a Christmas gift. This is just a little gift I think you'll like.

I finally got my three pair of shorts from the supply room. That puts me in pretty good shape now with seven pair. If you can get any to put in my Christmas package I'll be able to use them tho'. I never have too many shorts.

How's every thing going with you sweetie? Fine I hope. It's going to be so nice to come home and fire you from your job darling. Neither of us will feel badly about that, will we honey?
