Mrs. Anna E. Clark, Estate Owner, Dies

Mrs. Anna E. Clark, owner of the Clark Estate on East Cabrillo Boulevard and widow of U.S. Sen. William Andrews Clark of Montana, donor of the Bird Refuge, died today at her New York City home. She died in her home, 907 Fifth Ave. Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Huguette M. Clark, and a sister, Mrs. Amelia Semple, both of New York.

Her death was reported in a telephone call this afternoon from New York. Requiem Mass will be in New York Monday in the St. Jean Baptiste Church. Private interment will be at Woodlawn Cemetery in New York. The Frank E. Campbell Funeral Home of New York is in charge.

Mrs. Clark married Sen. Clark in 1901. He died in 1925. Sen. Clark, a copper magnate, provided the land and the money for the Andree Clark Bird Refuge, named in memory of a daughter, and donated it to the city.

Mrs. Clark was known as a patroness of the arts and supported the Corcoran Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C.,

Anna Clark Estate To Go to Daughter

Mrs. Hugette M. Clark, of New York, daughter of Mrs. Anna M. Clark, is major heir to her mother's estate, according to a will filed in Surrogate Court for New York county.

Mrs. Clark, according to the

will, bequeathed to her daughter the well-known Clark Estate on East Cabrillo Boulevard as well as her Rancho Alegre in Santa Ynez Valley.

In her will, Mrs. Clark, for many years a part-time resident of Santa Barbara and widow of former U.S. Sen. William Andrews Clark of Montana, bequeaths to Albert H. Hoelscher, a Clark Estate employe, and Neils F. Larsen, a Rancho Alegre employe, \$500 apiece for each year they have been in her service.

Institutions remembered by Mrs. Clark in her will include the Corcoran Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C., \$150,000, plus a collection of Instruments; the Girl Scouts of America, \$100,000; the United Hospital Fund of New York, \$100,000; the Juilliard School of Music, \$100,000; the American Red Cross, \$100,000, and the Graymoor Franciscan Friars of the Atonement, \$10,000.

Her sister, Mrs. Amelia Semple, of New York, will be the beneficiary of a \$500,000 trust fund. A similar trust fund will be established for the benefit of Mrs. Clark's sister-in-law, Hannah LaChapelle.

In her will, Mrs. Clark also remembered a number of friends with cash bequests
