Dear Mr. Temianka,

It was so very kind of you to write a little time ago to invite Joseph Saxby and me to play at Royce Hall with you on Sunday, 5th November, 1972. We would have been only too happy to accept, but I am afraid that we shall have left the western States by that time, for the completion of our tour in the east.

As our schedule stands at present, we appear to be available between 18th and 28th October, with a preference for the earlier half of that period. I do hope that it will be possible for you to arrange a concert to include recorder concertos (ancient or modern) with your Chamber Symphony or, failing this, a solo recital or lecture-recital. Concerning the question of honorarium, this is normally \$850, but we would be prepared to accept a confidential fee of \$600 in special circumstances.

Regarding the 1973 Haslemere Festival, we shall be very happy to have you participate with us during the Festival Week, on the clear understanding that your visit here coincides with a European tour and that you would be available in England at that period for rehearsal.

Joseph Saxby and I have the most pleasurable memories of the day we spent with you and your wife. I hope you managed to get the article about our work published and I would be very interested to see a copy.
