I have just finished reading your book FACING THE MUSIC, and as one of your probably long-forgotten students (I took a few lessons from you in San Francisco circa 1940), I wish to compliment you on writing a work which is felicitous, witty, and most informative.

It was in San Jose, California, that I first heard your name. Mrs. Edith Sheller, a little gray haired violin teacher who was an acquaintance of mine, was extolling your virtues as a violinist and teacher whose native tongue was not English.
