TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Re: Henri Temianka

This is to certify that Mr. Henri Temianka has suffered a severe injury to the right side of his chest and to his left lower leg. This occurred while the patient was on tour and riding in a car. He was taken to the Community Hospital in Hillsdale, Michigan, with multiple rib fractures. He was able to fly home January 23rd.

Mr. Temianka was first examined by me on January 27th. Additional x-rays revealed simple and comminuted fractures of the right ribs, from the sixth to the eleventh, as well as a fracture of the neck of the left fibula. Treatment consisted of a rib belt and a novocaine injection into the fracture site of the left fibula.

In view of the rather serious nature of these injuries, it was quite doubtful whether the patient would be able to play his concert scheduled for February 12th in Washington, D. C., and it is owing only to Mr. Temianka's full cooperation and strong determination that he will be able to keep this engagement.

A series of ultra shortwave treatments has been started and seems to help the patient considerably.
