I am now mailing you one made privately by someone in the audience. It contains the jazz version of the slow movement of the Fifth Brandenburg Concerto, followed by a classical performance of the entire Fourth Concerto, which you may want to skip to save time. Be sure, however, to listen to the jazz version of the slow movement of the Fourth, which follows the performance of the entire Concerto.

The success of this joint venture was so great that we have now been engaged to repeat it at the Lake Tahoe Summer Music Festival on August 17th.

Please treat this tape confidentially, as the local Union is very touchy about this kind of thing, and return it to me when you have finished with it.
