Absolutely first-class letter in this morning's Times! I agree with every syllable, & despair that the authorities will accept even a tenth of your advice. The whites I talk to in Santa Barbara think (a) there ought to be lots more police in LA (b) the criminals should be put in jail for life, all of them (c) the other residents of Watts ought to be made to live in the rubble for an indefinite period as an example to obstreperous Negroes elsewhere and to expiate the common guilt, and (d) nothing should be done that would cost any tax money aside from paying for more policemen because "this would be rewarding lawlessness."
