Mr.T. Did you receive fifty thousand dollars from the National Association of Manufacturers?


Dr F. No -never a cent except modest expense money when I went to New York to speak before their Meeting some years ago.

Mr T. What is your attitude toward Fascism?

Dr F. I am opposed to it but want the right to define it. Some parlor pinks believe everyone not a Communist is a Fascist and of course I share no such view.

They are not intended to cover the subjects amply nor conclusively but you indicated they will enable you conscientiously to appear Sunday and in that interest I am glad to set them forth.
