Dear Mr Temianka,

In accordance with your request and as a common courtesy I am glad to set down and sign the following,-

- Mr. T. "Did you ever advertise in Winrod's periodical"?
- Dr F. Yes, Spiritual Mobilization with which I am identified ran three adds in it. A public Statement concerning that error was printed in the Christian Century and other publications months or perhaps a year ago.
- Mr.T. Did you receive fifty thousand dollars from the National Association of Manufacturers?
- Dr F. No -never a cent except modest expense money when I went to New York to speak before their Meeting some years ago.
- Mr T. What is your attitude toward Fascism?
- Dr F. I am opposed to it but want the right to define it. Some parlor pinks believe everyone not a Communist is a Fascist and of course I share no such view.

These lines are set forth in consideration of the fact that you are envolved in a Concert scheduled here next Sunday. They are not intended to cover the subjects amply nor conclusively but you indicated they will ennable you conscienably to appear Sunday and in that interest I am glad to set them forth.
