It warms my heart because I am well aware of the unjustified treatment you have to endure from some of the critics. What I wanted to impress you with is the useless endeavor to battle against windmills. You never can win a fight against the newspapers - they always have the last word. It is a waste of strength and nerves. In Bavarian dialect one says: "Gar nicht ignorieren." The Mehtas, father and son, share with you this ungrateful treatment; but their Indian fatalism prevents them from fighting back - or is it wisdom?

I am eager to know what happened to your protest

against the most unfair insinuations of  
Mr. Segal. It was your humane idealism  
playing for the unfortunate Jews at their  
Culture Bund.
