Dear Mr. Fickler:

When Mr. Temianka left Jerusalem on August 30 after completing his contractual engagement with the Israel Broadcasting Authority, you were evidently unable to pay him the balance of his honorarium, as per agreement. Instead, you proposed to send a check directly to his bank in Los Angeles, and assured him that this would be credited to his account by the time he returned to Los Angeles at the end of September. However, a check for \$32.14, only a fraction of the money due, was dispatched by you from Jerusalem on the date of October 25, and received in Los Angeles on October 31.

Please remit the remaining balance of Mr. Temianka's honorarium. The total sum due was 1800 pounds for the rehearsals and recordings, plus 315 pounds for hotel expenses. Of this, Mr. Temianka received 1575 pounds while in Jerusalem, leaving a balance of 540 pounds, the approximate equivalent of \$135.00. There now remains an unpaid balance of approximately \$100.00, which we look forward to receiving promptly.
