Dear Mr. Temianka,

Thank you for your letter of June 18, and for your second letter containing your forwarding addresses for the coming months, dated June 28. I have been away on a short vacation, and having just returned, am able to answer your letters only today.

Regarding your request, I have planned the first session with the orchestra for August 27 at 9.30 a.m. in Jerusalem. From the list of repertoire you sent us, we choose for the studio recordings

- 1) Beethoven. Grossefuge Op. 133
- 2) a violin concerto with string accompaniment, with you as soloist and conductor

If you would care to have someone else as conductor for this second, solo piece, this would present no problem to us.

We are able to offer you H900 for each piece recorded, plus H45 for expenses during each day you work with us. I shall ask you to send me, by cable, if possiblo, how many total sessions you will need for preparing and recording the Grossefuge and the solo concerto. I understand that it is not easy for you to decide this, not knowing the orchestra, on the one hand, and knowing the technical difficulty of the Grossefuge.

Hoping to receive a positive answer from you shortly, by the fastest possible means.
