Dear Mr. Goldberg:

The opening statement in your review in this morning's Times is not accurate. "Let's Talk Music" has included contemporary compositions in its programs ever since the series was inaugurated.

Last season Mr. Temianka gave the West Coast premiere of Alberto Ginastera's Cantata Para Magica (composed in 1960.) He also performed Britten's Les Illuminations. The season before that, which was our first, included performances of Poulenc's Bal Masque, Milhaud's La Creation du Monde, Bloch's Concerto Grosso No. 1, Prokofiev's Classical Symphony and Britten's Variations on a Theme of Purcell.

Mr. Temianka has consistently adhered to a policy of presenting complete concert programs in the course of which each work is performed without interruption, the only commentary being given before the performance of each composition.
