1965 - Prosent Frank I. Tobin & Son, Inc., Riverside, California, Building & Construction Firm since 1930: Vice President. In charge of merchandising, advertising, personnel, public relations and general sales administration.

Annual Gross: \$15,000,000. Executive Director. Had across-the-board responsibility for administrative policy, personnel, training, advertising, public relations and troubleshooting. Authored and edited advertising copy, sales manuals, newspaper and magazine articles. Reduced overall operation costs by 17% and increased production (over past six months) by 27%. Obtained high client response to advertising material; designed streamlined expansion plans.

1949 - 1957. Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Studios, Culver City, California. Motion Picture Producers. Concertmaster & Soloist. Directed Studio Symphony Orchestra in recording the film music for various productions.

1945 - 1949. Concert Artist (Violin). Toured U.K., France, Switzerland, Italy, Scandinavia, and the U.S. Performed with major Symphony Orchestras throughout the world, including the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. Performed at Carnegie Hall; gave three performances at The White House. Acted as the Concertmaster with The National Symphony Orchestra at Washington, D.C.

1910 - 1915. Student. Concurrently: (1945) Concertmaster: Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo. Concurrently: Various Concert tours and (1943-1945) Service with U.S. Army, 1st Lt. G.2. Traveled with USO to Greenland, Labrador and Iceland.

1935 - 1940. As Concert Violinist toured many countries in Europe and Africa. Performed before the crowned heads of Europe. Received the order of "The Golden Fleece" from Jugoslavia and the "George Cross" from Monaco.
