Dear Henri,

Thank you very much for the two wonderful letters. As you can see, I am in America already and look forward to seeing you again soon and having the opportunity to play with none other than you as a conductor. I am somewhat concerned that my concert tour is going to be quite intense and tiring, particularly the week between the 14th and 21st of November (New Orleans on the 14th, Berkeley on the 16th, San Francisco on the 17th, Los Angeles on the 19th and Pasadena on the 20th). That is why I doubt very much that I will have enough time and strength to enjoy playing chamber music at your house as we did during my last visit, when it gave me such enormous pleasure.

But this time, I am afraid that on the 18th in the evening I shall have to work on the concerts we are going to perform with you, and also to get some rest before the next day, which promises to be a very difficult one. Unfortunately, the concert in Pasadena is not the last one on my tour. I shall have to leave immediately to New York for the continuation of the tour, which does not end until well into the month of December.

So, my dear friend, we shall see each other very soon! Tamara and I send our heartfelt greetings to you, dear Emmy and your entire family.
