

Dear Senator McGovern:

I have been your consistent supporter in word and deed ever since you emerged on the national scene as a voice of sanity. I am therefore doubly dismayed to read your statement in to-day's Los Angeles Times, which must indeed give aid and comfort to Soviet Russia, its ailies, satellites and pawns. That you should have joined the poor blind politicians who profess to see two and a half million israelis as a threat to one hundred million Arabs backed by the Russian colossus, comes as a profound shock. Aithough you do not so intend it, what you are now calling for is in effect the distruction of israel. Your change of heart fills me with great sorrow and disillusionment.
