Dear Minna:


You will recall that I indicated to you I would like to talk with you sometime about something I think you could do to help us in musical programming on Channel 28. I'm sorry that my schedule has become so jammed for the rest of this month that I cannot get to it, but I still intend to call you for a date early in October, at which time I would like to bring along Henri Temianka. We have a notion involving the California Chamber Symphony and the use of distinguished young artists as guests with that group which we think has a great deal to recommend it. Frankly, we would like to have you think about some people who might be willing to be "patrons" for a series of perhaps 5 or 6 one-hour programs in a year's time. Each of these would cost in the neighborhood of \$5000. I had the thought that you might be willing to arrange some kind of informal social gathering to which a number of possible patrons could be invited, that we could show them the pilot program which already has been produced here at KCET, and our own development staff would follow up to see who we could sign up as patrons. Your role would simply be to

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help us select the best possible prospects
and to get them together under your auspices,
in that you are a great friend of young
artists, of Maestro Temianka and the California
Chamber Symphony, and of Channel 28 and would
be doing all of us a great favor.

Think about this a little bit and I will call
you early in October.
