
Dear Henri:

I hope this letter catches up to you somewhere around the world, even though it does not require any sort of immediate answer.

When you called me the day after having recorded the pilot program of our hoped-for new series, I wish I had been able to tell you what my people told me later in the day. They wanted me to convey to you their thanks for your patience and cooperation. They were delighted with the final results of the program, but realized, as you did, that the musicians became more and more tired and it was difficult for everyone to complete the job. Although you had reflected this to me also, and we believe that your suggestion for "next time" is worth consideration, I just wanted you to know that our hard-working people here appreciated the kind of patience and cooperation which you and your people demonstrated.

I've been out-of-town for a week but hope now to get busy to see what can be done to find some patrons for our anticipated Fall series. We will keep in touch with you.
