## **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

Something old, something new; it all revolves around the moon.

Welcome to the 2024 spring opera double bill featuring Mozart's serenata *Il sogno di Scipione* and Robert Moran's *From the Towers of the Moon*. Our productions blend the classical and contemporary, all centered around the enigmatic allure of the moon.

In *Il sogno di Scipione*, we journey into a dream world far above the earth where the protagonist, Scipione, encounters two goddesses, between whom he must choose one to follow.

Our second offering recounts an ancient Japanese fairy tale where a goddess from the moon is sent to earth in human form to learn about life on earth. While *II sogno di Scipione* is a classical-era opera, we have given it a retrofuturist setting, including commercial choreography from senior Chapman dance major Jean Park. *From the Towers of the Moon* is a contemporary opera, yet we approached it with reverence for traditional Japanese theater, dance and costuming.

In the 55th year since Americans first stepped foot on the moon, our version of *II sogno di Scipione* tells the tale of a young woman who yearns to be an astronaut. As she drifts off to sleep, she wakes in a dream where she is met by the goddess Fortune and goddess Constancy. Each battles for Scipione's attention with their armies of Fortuna-bots and Costanza-bots. In this dream, Scipione also meets her ancestors Publio, the first woman astronaut, and even Mozart herself! Each lectures her on her tasks on earth to achieve greatness. But which path will the confused and, at times, distracted Scipione choose? Will it be immediate fortune and fame, or long-term planning? Stay tuned to find out!

From the Towers of the Moon (1991) tells the story of Princess Kaguya from The Tale of the Bamboo Cutter (竹取物語), a goddess from the moon sent

to earth in human form, inadvertently teaching the world the meaning of love and protection. When I first came across this opera, it was through a transcendent aria filmed by PBS and four movements of a string quartet extracted from scenes of the opera. Given the subject matter of the work and my own experiences with traditional Japanese theater, I knew this would be the perfect companion piece for Opera Chapman to pair with *II sogno di Scipione*. However, there was no published score or recording of the piece. Through many contacts, I reached out to the composer, who graciously sent us the music scores that had been hiding away in his attic since the opera's 1991 premiere. With the help of Chapman music student Connor Low, who transcribed all the string parts, we had a completed version ready for performance, resurrecting what could have easily been a lost opera!

Together with an incredible team of creative artists—Saori Mitome, David Murakami and Tesshi Nakagawa—we began to research the Heian Period to create the world of our show. Meanwhile, our student cast had the opportunity to workshop with famed Nihon-buyō dancer and teacher Bandō Hidesomi to learn the basics of traditional Japanese dance, which you will see infused in this evening's performance. As the director, I owe much to them and to my students' hard work, but also to my sensei Bandō Hirohichirō, Noboyuki Ōe, Shingo Katayama, Tatsushige Udaka, and Diego Pellechia.

**MARC CALLAHAN** (Director) is Associate Professor and Robert and Norma Lineberger Endowed Chair in Music at Chapman University and director of Opera Chapman. As a director and designer, Dr. Callahan received critical acclaim for his production of Jean-Philippe Rameau's *Les Indes Galantes*, saying it was "designed and directed with jaw-dropping invention," and was awarded first prize for his production of Kurt Weill's *Der Jasager* from the National Opera Association as well honors from the American Prize's Charles C. Reilly Director's Prize. He has worked on productions at the Royal Opera House, the Aldeburgh Festival, the Holland Festival, Scottish Opera, Miami Music Festival, the New World Center, Théâtre du Châtelet, and the Théâtre du Capitole. Recent productions include A Midsummer Night's Dream, Albert Herring, Ordo Virtutum, The Marriage of Figaro, Cendrillon, and The Blue Forest, Help, Help, the Globolinks!, Der Jasager, Lohengrin, Alcina, ATLAS, Die Walküre, Il sogno di Scipione, and L'incoronazione di Poppea ("...devising a brilliant production of remarkable dramatic intimacy").

**TESSHI NAKAGAWA** (Scenic Designer) is delighted to be returning to Chapman University's College of Performing Arts, where he previously designed Avenue Q in 2018. Hailing from Tokyo, Japan, Tesshi has been working in the theater, film, and commercial industries as a scenic designer/ art director. His work has graced numerous venues across the Los Angeles area, including the Pasadena Playhouse, A Noise Within, Boston Court Pasadena, South Coast Repertory, Antaeus Theater, Lewis Family Playhouse, Sierra Madre Playhouse, East West Players, Los Angeles Theater Center and International City Theater. He currently serves as an adjunct professor/ instructor at East Los Angeles College. Tesshi is a proud graduate of UCLA. www.tesshi.com.

**SAORI MITOME** (Costume Designer) is a Los-Angeles based costume/clothing designer and a seamstress, originally from Japan. She creates custom-made

While she is working at the costume company, Saori also had the opportunity to create costumes for Reba McEntire's U.S. tour 2022–23 and Disney and Universal Studio Hollywood theme parks.

Saori has also designed and hand-made clothing for concept fashion presentations including fashion design competitions. In 2022, she was the Japanese designer finalist at the 10th Metropolitan Fashion Week at the Los Angeles City Hall, an International fashion competition that featured highfashion masterpieces inspired by world architecture. A piece she created for the Metropolitan Fashion Week was exhibited in March 2023 at The Palm Springs Art Museum, and she participated in the 11th Metropolitan Fashion Week Los Angeles show as the headliner of the event in October 2023. She has received the 1st prize in the Eco-Couture Fashion Competition produced by Goodwill Southern California in June 2023.

**CAMILLE ROBERTS**, she/her (Lighting Designer), is an L.A.-based designer and alumna of Chapman University. Nominated for Orange County Theatre Guild and Broadway World awards for lighting design, she has had the privilege to design for a multitude of productions in her career, including iLuminate at the STRAT Casino and Hotel in Las Vegas and New York, and a variety of dance shows and musicals in the L.A. area. Additionally, she has worked as a lighting technician on music festivals including EDC Las Vegas, Countdown, HARD Summer and others with Insomniac Events. In addition to opera, she has premiered many contemporary chamber works with the New Juilliard Ensemble, under the baton of Joel Sachs. Dr. Kao holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Keyboard Collaborative Arts from the University of Southern California, in addition to a collaborative arts degree from the Juilliard School and a piano performance degree from the Peabody Conservatory. Dr. Kao is currently an adjunct professor and opera coach at Chapman University and Fullerton College.




