
A quick answer to your welcome letter, which I do in outline form.

1. Miss Inglis has already received a letter from me regarding transportation and hotel reservations.
2. I am delighted that Gregg Smith will perform my "Carols of Death" at the luncheon October 3rd. Please, there must be a couple of other pieces. I can't be represented by death alone at a luncheon! Gregg Smith knows other choral pieces of mine, and perhaps will agree to open with something else and close with something else. If he just does "Carols of Death", the cuisine should contain gentle doses of arsenic.
3. I cannot arrive on Friday morning. I have performances that whole weekend at the Philharmonic, and I feel that I must attend at least two, to wit: Thursday night and Friday afternoon. I will, I hope, be taking the 6 o'clock flight from New York on October 3rd. If it's important, I could meet with the press that evening. You will know whether this timing could work.
