
Newsweek has forwarded me your letter of 24 April 1975 regarding my article about the CIA. Thank you for your interest. A delay in response has been due to travel and work on further articles.

My mental relapse lapse in putting Benes out of the window instead of Jan Masaryk was an innocnet one. However, you may or may not be familiar with the official investigation of this episode made in 1968 during the Dubcek regime, which report concluded that Masaryk was indeed thrown to his death by members of the Soviet Secret Police.

The text of this report is now hard to find and has of course been repudiated by the subsequent Communist governments, including the present one.

Otherwise, I hope you agreed with my article in regard to the vital usefulness of the VIA.
