Dear Alan:

The process of obtaining the Stravinsky tape from the radio station that recorded it has been similar to a very painful tooth-pulling session, hence the delay. Under separate cover I now have mailed to you the tape, and I am eagerly looking forward to your reaction.

I am disappointed to have heard nothing further from you regarding the Beethoven tape which Mr. Shure reportedly has given to you some considerable time ago. I only wish you could also hear the performance of the Bach Brandenburg #6 which I taped for National Educational Television.

I suggest that you call Curtis Davies or Tom Slevin at the headquarters at Columbus Circle in New York and tell them you would like to hear the performance at my suggestion. I hope you will not consider this a statement of conceit if I say I think it is the best recorded performance of that work which I have ever heard.
