On the eve of the Senate vote on the AWACS sale, I am writing to express my appreciation for your words of support and encouragement.

As you know, things went very well in the House of Representatives. We were able to defeat the AWACS proposal by a vote of about three to one. I hope the heavy vote against AWACS in the House will give our supporters in the Senate the courage to resist White House pressure.

From every thing I have read and heard, President Reagan is giving this battle the maximum attention possible. Senators are being "treated" to intimate sessions with the President and his top level advisors. These sessions include not only a detailed discussion on AWACS replete with numerous reassurances, but, also a full discussion of the Senator's home state political situation.

Let me take this opportunity to tell you how grateful I am for the friendship you have shown me in the past. It seems we invariably find ourselves on the same side of every key issue, whether foreign or domestic. I hope my work in Congress continues to merit me your approval.

I plan to be in Los Angeles the first week in December, and will give you a call to see if we can arrange an appointment.
