Greetings to Emmy and thank you for your hospitality, Your Milhaud"

and then the second letter, undated:

"My Dear Henri: What a sumptuous album! Thank you with all my heart. It's a beautiful souvenir of a beautiful sojourn. Aside from the manifestations of the French week in which I participated, I was very happy to hear your remarkable chamber orchestra playing the Mozart serenade so well. It's an excellent ensemble of which you are the soul. Most affectionately to all of you, Milhaud"
