Concerning Lewis Segal' answer to "Temianka's Complaint", I would like to rectify an obvious misunderstanding on the part of Mr. Segal in his judgment of

Temianka's performing in NazinGermany.

Where Temianka performed in the earlier phase of the Hitler Regime, (and where I was part of the audience) was an organization called [Juedischer Kulturbund", which presented Concerts and Stage Plays, performed exclusively by Jewish artists before exclusively Jewish audiences. This was, roughly between 1933 and 1936, the only opportunity for Jews in Germany to attend any such cultural events at all. Although the performances were permitted by the Nazis, participating in them cannot be considered a "reflection of insensitivity to the policies of the Nazi Regime" any more than, say, using a German, swastika-adorned passport for the purpose of emigration to a free country was an act of collaboration with the Nazi Regime!
