Sir:

The blind ignorance and prejudice that permeate your two letters on "Israel's Air Force" (Look, August 1) can only be exposed through the official figures and facts included in every encyclopedia and atlas. The land that is now istael was for four hundred years under Turkish rele, a sparsely inhabited heap of barren sand and rocks, as a result of centuries of Turkish and Arab neglect. Compare its 8,000 square miles and 2.8 million inhabitants to the one half million square miles and 35 million population of the four countries surrounding israel, i.e. Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria. The figures rise steeply to two and a half million square miles and 75 million people if one adds some of the other Arab countries such as iraq, Libya etc. Compare the hundreds of thousands of Jewish victims of Arab persecution which israel has promptly absorbed and resettled in its tiny country, with the inhuman Arab treatment of its refugees, cruelly exploited for propaganda purposes.

One would have thought that after the grisly murder of six million
Jews in World War II, climaxing two thoughand years of monstrous
persecution, the Christian and Moslem world would have felt some
pangs of conscience with regard to the Jewish survivors in Istael
but evidently no such conscience exists. The miraculous transformation wrought by israel on the previously barren land, the incredible
flowering of its arts, industry, agriculture, education, health and
its truly democratic structure have only aroused the greed and envy
of the Arabs. On a recent visit I saw the President and Prime
Minister of Israel mingling freely with the audience at a concert is
Jerusalem, without visible protection. I have seen the wretched
Arab people cross the borders into Israel to receive, free, the modern
medical treatment which they are unable to receive in there own
country. They are coming by the thousands.

You, the editors of Look, have it in your power to expose the wicked and dangerous lies of the vast Russian-Arab propaganda machine. I see millions of uninformed, guilible people being whipped into the same kind of frenzied anti-Semitism that we remember so well from the Hitler era.
