Your editorial "The Decline of Pornography" (April 23) is an exer-

cise in absurd exaggeration.

You state: "Over the past two decades, all of the arts have mainly and assiduously asserted that the only reality is the mean, the vulgar, the contemptible, a view which, in essence, is antilife."

There is not enough space or time to list all the striking examples to the contrary, from such films as, "A Man for All Seasons," to the music of Rubinstein and Casals, the paintings of Chagall, the sculptures of

Lipchitz the War Requiem of Britten, and books, plays, poems, and ballets too numerous to mention.

"All of the arts" covers a lot of ground. Let us not forget that the mean and the vulgar have always thrived side by side with the sublime. It is, in essence, not "antilife," but on the contrary, life, and reality.
