Ich komme wahrscheinlich im Februar in London vorbei, aber nur auf einige Tage ohne zu arbeiten und dadurch mit doppelt so viel Zeit für alle Freunde.

Hotel Westminster Nice, 24 December 1934.

Dear Temianka!

You can imagine how I rejoiced over your successes. Now just onwards and onwards. I am going to America on 10 January, although I am extraordinarily pleased here. We have good friends here and the best Riviera weather. In Monte Carlo we heard Stravinsky with Dushkin. I was surprised to find that Stravinsky has written so many great works for the violin, and already look forward to the pleasure of hearing him once through you. When will we see each other again? I am probably passing through London in February, but just for a few days without having to work, and therefore with twice as much time for all friends.
