G.H. Jansen's lyrical paean to "Arab . . . emotional . . . sentimental oneness" (Opinion, Jan. 19) is naive and misleading in the extreme. From the murder of Egypt's Anwar Sadat to the countless attempts to assassinate King Hussein of Jordan, King Hassan of Procco, to the vicious killings among rival Palestine Liberation Organization factions, the current South Yemen civil war, to the oppression of Lebanese Arabs by Syria, Arab past and present history attests to the bloodcurdling feuds between Arabs everywhere.
