As our cities cultural affairs general manager correctly points out, our prized First Amendment guarantees everyone's right to incite violence, prejudice, discrimination, bigotry and hatred. All I expect is that, in the name of that same First Amendment, in future, alongside the anti-semitic filth, equal space and prominence be given to anti-Black, anti-Hispanic, anti-Catholic, anti-religious, anti-militaristic and anti-government displays.
