Dear Mr. Temianka,

I must apologize for not having replied earlier to your letter of the 28th September, but as I wrote before I was in Europe during the whole month of September.

Actually I was originally referring to the Quartet. As you said quite rightly, the equivalent of £ 1400 is roughly 4000 Dollars. I would suggest that you combine a tour once you are on the East Coast, similar to other Chambermusicgroups, who come to us from the States ( like recently the Hungarian Quartet, and before Luboshutz and Nemenoff).

I don't think I can "tackle" the "Little Symphony", unless the State Department will step in. In fact I know that they show great interest, provided I believe, if six countries are being visited by the Artists. This can be done easily.- I would suggest that you contact the State Department and channel any enquiries through Dr. A. Tressidder, the Foreign Affairs Department Attachee with the U. S. Embassy Pretoria, South Africa.
