Dear Dr. and Mrs. Heschel:

I hope you had a pleasant trip home and that the chaos of a return after a long time away is subsiding. Mr. and Mrs. Temianka would like me to express their pleasure at your having spent the summer in their home with the hopes that you were comfortable.

I've received the two final telephone bills, of which I'm enclosing a xerox copy. Your portion of the 870-4025 bill is \$44.84 and of the 837-3860 bill, \$12.64. The remaining gas and electric bills have not yet come. I will notify you of the balance when they arrive. As Mr. Temianka paid the first third of your phone bill covering July 1-11 totalling \$10.60, and the cost of repairs for the garbage disposal was \$19.86, which you paid, the total for utilities to date is \$48.22.

It is necessary for me to inform you of the following:

- 1) A red coffee pot was damaged beyond repair, apparently placed over direct heat. Value: \$19.89
- 2) A rocking chair, with a needlepoint seat, having sentimental value for Mrs. Temianka, was apparently left on the back porch for the summer. Cost to restore needlework: \$20.00
- 3) We are unable to locate two books, O Jerusalem and a book of drawings by Charles White, both autographed by the authors, making them sentimentally valuable and irreplaceable.

It was really a pleasure meeting and talking with you both this summer. I hope we have the opportunity to visit again in the future.
