Tom Campbell to Join Chapman School of Law

Former U.S. Congressman Will Serve as the Inaugural Presidential Fellow at Chapman Law School, Focusing on Antitrust, Legislative Process and Separation of Powers

ORANGE, Calif., June 12, 2008 – The Honorable Tom Campbell, former U.S. Congressman and California State Senator and currently dean and professor of business at UC Berkeley, has been appointed the inaugural Presidential Fellow in the Chapman University School of Law, it was announced today by Dean John Eastman of the Chapman law school.

Campbell will join the Chapman School of Law for a 2-year visiting appointment beginning in January 2009. He is currently completing a six-year stint as the Bank of America Dean and Professor of Business at the Haas School of Business, University of California, Berkeley. For the 20 years prior to that, he was a professor of law at Stanford Law School, a member of Congress from 1989-1993 and 1995-2001, a member of the California State Senate from 1993-95, and the Director of the California Department of Finance from 2004-05.

He has a B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago, and holds his J.D. from Harvard, where he also served as a member of the board of editors of the Harvard Law Review. He was a law clerk to Supreme Court Justice Byron White; a White House Fellow; Executive Assistant to the Deputy Attorney General, Department of Justice; and Director of the Bureau of Competition at the Federal Trade Commission.

He has also been serving on Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger's Council of Economic Advisors with Chapman University President Jim Doti, and has taught at Ashesi University in Ghana, the School of Banking and Finance and the Kigali Institute of Science and Technology in Rwanda, and the University of Asmara in Eritrea. Campbell has published in the Harvard, Stanford, Columbia, Texas, and UCLA law reviews and has written a book, *Separation of Powers in Practice*, published in 2004 by the Stanford University Press.

While at Chapman, he will teach antitrust, legislative process and a seminar on separation of powers.
