Dr. Nancy Segal, Director of CSUFs Twin Studies Center, Will Be Guest Speaker at Seventeenth Annual Science Conference Presented by OC Chapter of Graduate Women in Science

The public is invited to hear Dr. Nancy Segal, director of the Twin Studies Center at California State University, Fullerton, speak on Researching the Lives of Some Extraordinary Twins at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 11 at Chapman University, as part of the Seventeenth Annual Science Conference of the Orange County Chapter of Graduate Women in Science. As a leading researcher of twins, Dr. Segal has appeared on U.S. and British television and radio and as an expert witness at trials. She has written two books on twins: *Indivisible by Two: Lives of Extraordinary Twins*, published in 2005, and *Entwined Lives*, published in 1999.

Before and after Dr. Segals talk, local college students will give research presentations in the Irvine Lecture Hall, Rm. 150 Hashinger Science Center on the Chapman campus. The conference will award prizes for the best research at the undergraduate, master's and Ph.D. levels.
