Biography

Brian Jenkins is currently a sophomore at Chapman University studying as a Piano Performance major. Brian became interested in piano at age 15. After studying piano on his own for over a year, he began studying with Dr. Janice Park of Chapman University and Irvine Valley College. Brian has performed in masterclasses with pianists such as Abbey Simon, Robert Weirich, Lydia Bugoslavsky, Christopher O' Riley, and Jerry Wong. He won first prize in the 2004 MTAC Honors Audition Competition and went on to win Honorable Mention in the state finals in Sacramento. Brian also plays the saxophone for Chapman's Saxophone Quartet and Bass Clarinet for the Wind Symphony. He won multiple awards in high school including the John Phillips Sousa Band award and the Louis Armstrong Jazz award. In high school, he played the saxophone and the clarinet in various performance groups and he also played percussion for three years in the drumline. In February, Brian will serve a two-year mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Bangkok, Thailand. After the mission, he will return to Chapman University to continue pursuing his degree in music.
